## The Fishing Calendar

So, let's get right into it. The first part of the guide is actually the calendar. There are 12 total pages of the calendar (one for every month). Each month shows you not only what fish can be caught, but **when** they can be caught. You don't have to wonder any more if you are just waiting on the beach for a fish that may never come. Pay close attention to the legend at the bottom of each page. Some months (like September) can get absolutely crazy trying to figure out when a fish will show up and then leave. The legend colors will explain everything for you.

## Calendar Column Descriptions



**☑** : This is simply a column that you can use to check off if you've caught the fish listed. One of the possible goals in City Folk is to catch every fish. This will take almost a year of playing, but your reward will be the Golden Fishing Rod!

**Fish Name** : These are the fish that are available for each month and are sorted alphabetically for easy lookup.

**Bells** : If you sell the fish, this is the amount of bells that Tom Nook will give you. Tom loves fish. Sell as many as you want to him. You also have the option of donating your fish to the town museum. Although there is no monetary benefit to donation, you will be able to view your fish at any time. Who knows what Tom does with them?

**Size** : This is the size of the fish's shadow in the water. This is purely subjective on my part. What is huge in my mind, may just be partially gigantic in yours. Over time, you will be able to identify most fish that swim in your ocean and river just by looking at the shadow size.

**Location** : You can't just throw your bobber and bait into the river and expect to catch a shark, so I've given you this column to help you know where to find the fish you really want. The ocean and river are pretty self explanatory descriptions, but here is a brief description of all the locations.

**River** : Anywhere along the body of water that runs from North to South in your town.

**Ocean** : The southernmost body of water in your town. You'll find beautiful and rare shells here.

**Ocean (rain/snow)** : The Coelacanth can only be caught in the ocean on rainy or snow days.

**River Pond** : Look for a section of your river that is unusually wide. This is the river pond.

**River Mouth** : This is where your river meets the ocean.

**Holding Pond** : This is a small body of water surrounded by land and not attached to your river.

**AM & PM** : These are the hours that a particular fish is available to be caught. This does not guarantee that you will see this fish though during this hour. This only guarantees that if (for example) it is 3:24 pm in your town and there isn't an "X" in the 3 pm box, you will not see the fish. Fish appearances appear to be random, but will always fall into the timeframes I have created in the calendar.

**Pink** : This color indicates that the fish will not be available next month. If you are trying to catch every type of fish, you'll need to make sure you take the time and hunt down the fish marked with this color or you may be out of luck.

**Yellow** : This color indicates that the fish is new this month. In other words, last month you would not have been able to catch the fish.

**Yellow & Pink** : A couple of fish only show up for a short period of time (15 days). I've marked these fish with both yellow and pink.

## Tips & Tricks

### #1 : No Running!

I know, I know. Telling you not to run makes me sound like an old man, but heed my advice. Running (holding down the B button and moving your nunchuck stick) will scare away any fish that you are close to. Make a habit of never running. Running destroys grass and snow quicker and can remove patterns from your ground as well. If you walk and jog, you will be just fine and the fish won't even know you're there.

### #2 : Double-Click is Your Friend

You can cast out your bait many ways. You can make a throwing motion with your Wii remote or aim your character with the nunchuck and then press the A or C button. But I've found that simply aiming your Wii remote at the area of the water you want to cast out to and double-clicking (press A or C twice, quickly) is the fastest and most accurate method. I always double-click because sometimes the pop-up menu at the bottom of the game is visible and the double-click eliminates it and casts out the bait.

### #3 : Aim In Front Of The Head

This is probably an obvious tip, but I thought I'd include it just in case. Always try and aim your bait just a little bit in front of the fish's head. When they see it, you'll know. Their fishy bodies kind of jerk just a little, telling you that they've noticed the bait. I find it easier on the river to get beneath the fish and throw it over its body and in front of the head. Your mileage may vary though.

### #4 : Use The Force, Luke

Want to catch every fish that nibbles on your bait? Well my secret is to "use the force." I know this may seem weird, but the sound the bobber makes when it goes under the water is heard a split second before the bobber actually goes down. Additionally, when you watch the fish on the screen, you tend to get nervous because you see it launching itself towards your bait. Believe me, when you can teach yourself to catch fish by ear, rather than sight, you will catch more fish. Try to disregard the vibrations in the Wii remote as well. They just play with your nerves and tease you. Here is a quick synopsis of what I do to reel in the big ones.

- 1) Cast out the bait in front of the fish's head.
- 2) Watch to make sure the fish recognizes the bait (jerks body).
- 3) Close my eyes and relax.
- 4) Concentrate and wait for the "bloop" sound, while ignoring the vibrations.
- 5) Immediately press the A button and pull up the Wii remote as I would a fishing pole.

My fiancé saw me doing this one day and thought I was a tool. Of course, hours later I saw her doing the same thing with great success. It is our preferred method. Oh, and I bet you wonder why I press both the A button and pull up on the Wii remote when I catch fish. Well, I'm really not sure if my thumb or arm muscles have a quicker reaction time, so I perform both methods at the same time. It seems to work better for me. Just be sure not to whack your forehead when your eyes are closed. Good luck explaining that injury to your doctor.

## **#5 : Five Nibbles Max**

Fish only nibble a maximum of 5 times. So if you've felt the vibrations of a fish 4 times, you know the next nibble will be when the bobber goes down. If you "use the force" and have your eyes closed, feel free to open them after the 4<sup>th</sup> nibble. If you pull in the fish immediately on the 5<sup>th</sup> bite, you'll be sitting pretty with a brand new fish squirming in your pocket.

## **#6: Oooh, A Fish Near A Bridge!**

My friends wonder how I catch so many fish as quickly as I do. Well the secret is to not waste your time on the fish that are difficult to aim for. The fish that play around the bridges are notorious time wasters. You could sit for minutes just throwing out your bait and reeling it back in over and over just for one fish. Don't bother. Run to another section of the river or to your ocean. Don't worry -- the bridge fish will eventually just disappear or travel further up or down the river.

## **#7: The Silver And Golden Fishing Rods**

First and foremost, you want these – or at least one of them.

- **The Silver Rod** : This can be found in Tom Nook's shop after it has been upgraded to the Nook N' Go. It is not common to find one, so if you see it, snatch it up and the rewards will be great! A silver rod will attract the attention of fish further away than the basic rod does – plus it's just cool to own one.
- **The Golden Rod** : After you catch every fish (you read that right, all 64 of them), go see Tortimer in the Town Hall and he'll give you the coveted gold rod. It attracts fish at an even greater distance and also keeps the fish biting on the bait for a bit longer, which will allow you to catch fish more easily.

## **#8 : Having Fun At The Waterfall**

Did you know that you can stand at the top of the lower waterfall and throw your bobber/bait down to the pool below? If not, then try. It's great fun and you never know what kind of fish you'll catch in there. This tip can be useful if you notice a fish swimming close to the edge of the waterfall. It's also one of the nicest views in your town.

## **#9 : Villagers Love Fresh Fish**

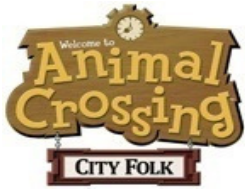
You've just caught a huge Tuna or Coelecanth in the ocean. What is the first thing you should do? If you say sell the fish to Tom Nook, you'd be wrong. You see, the villagers in your town love to collect rare and expensive fish and will pay a hefty premium of bells to get their hands on your recent catch. Depending on your relationship level with a villager, you can make over double what Tom Nook would give you for that fish. To pull off a fish transaction with a villager, follow these steps.

- 1) Catch a rare fish (usually one that is worth over 2,000 bells).
- 2) Make sure you have at least one empty spot in your pocket. If your pockets are full, drop something or release one of the lower cost fish into the water.
- 3) Walk around town and locate your villagers. Get close to one of them and see if they automatically notice you and want to talk with you (a sound is played and an exclamation point is shown over their head). If a villager doesn't notice you, don't try and force it by clicking on them. Simply walk around and find a different animal to talk to.
- 4) Click on the Villager and see if they want to make a deal for your new fish. Sometimes the deals are good and sometimes they are bad. In my opinion, I believe that the higher relationship you have with the villager, the better the deal that is offered.
- 5) Don't bother going into villager's houses. Just try to find the ones that are walking around.

## #10 : Change Your Fishing Luck Around In An Instant

Have you ever been fishing your ocean or river and thought that there “just aren't any good fish swimming right now”? A quick way to switch things up and to “reload” your waters with fresh fish is to go into a house (either yours or a villager's) and then exit the house immediately. Every fish in your water will be replaced with a fresh batch. To increase my odds for catching expensive fish, I will enter and leave a house every time I catch a fish that I've tagged as a rare fish. In my experience there seems to be around 10 fish swimming the oceans and rivers at one time and there is usually only 1 rare fish (if that). In theory, if you reset the waters using this trick, you will have a much better shot at pulling in another big fish quickly. Your mileage may vary, but it is a fun method to test out.

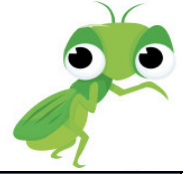
